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Blues, Rockabilly highlighted in fourth Rising Creek Music performance

Blues artist Old School Jones and Savannah rockabilly band Brady and the Bazookas will headline the fourth edition of the *Rising Creek Music Series* at the Emma Kelly Theater on March 12.

Rising Creek spotlights local and area musicians and gives them a chance to perform original music on the Jan Brown Anderson stage. A collaboration between the Averitt Center for the Arts and BHarvey Music, the fourth event spotlights Jones, Aaron Tanner, Danny Moon and Brady and the Bazookas.

Tanner is a country singer-songwriter whose twangy, yet soulful, baritone voice reaches into your being and plants whatever emotion it pleases while his thought-provoking songwriting style will have you wondering where you are, where you've been, and most of all, where you are going. Combine this with his Brent Mason and Vince Gill-inspired **chicken pickin'** and you have a powerhouse of talent that will leave an audience wanting more. Aaron writes and performs music that speaks to those sitting on a bar stool just as well as to those sitting on a church pew.

Moon grew up in Jackson, Michigan; playing in marching and symphonic bands as well as basement rock groups. In 2002, he moved to Columbus, Ohio and was a snare drummer for the Ohio State University Marching Band and began playing indie rock and jazz/world music. In 2007, he moved to Boston to attend the Berklee College of Music and majored in Drumset Performance before moving to New York in 2009 to start his professional music career. He takes on the purpose of the drummer as a dynamic and profound responsibility. He has a knack for changing feels, grooving seamlessly and "bringing it back into the pocket" at just the right time. His improvisation and creativity provide the foundation for his musical prowess.

Jones, also known as **Old School Jones**, is originally from Tupelo, Mississippi, and is a blues singer. Henry was also the 2018 First Coast Blues Society Regional Blues Challenge Winner in Jacksonville, Florida and 2019 International Blues Challenge Solo Artist Representative in Memphis, Tennessee. If you like Old School Blues music, he's sure to please.

Brady and the Bazookas formed in Savannah and is a rockabilly and vintage inspired rock-and-roll band. Brady is heavily influenced by The Stray Cats, Gene Vincent and the Blue Caps, and Carl Perkins. He is also influenced by modern players like Darrell Highan and the Reverend Horton Heat. Brady is also an Air Force Veteran and likes to play the most American music possible because of his service. In the first year of the band's "life", it earned the second most fan-voted spot in **Bryan County's Best Magazine**. They have also released an EP and a few singles and played in sold-out shows in Savannah.
