

KIMBERLY FOXX FEATURED IN 5th ANNUAL “BEHOLD”

Celebrating its 5th year, BEHOLD, HERE COMETH THE DREAMER has become an annual, reliable forum for the enjoyment and exploration of African-American poetry. Conceived as a tribute to the legacy of Martin Luther King, Jr., once again the event will take place at the Whitaker Black Box Theatre on West Main at 7:30 pm on Saturday, January 25th. Ressie Fuller and Corliss Reese will serve as the hosts of the evening which has been sponsored exclusively by Francys Johnson, Attorney and Counselor at Law.

Selected readings range from the famous words of Martin Luther King, Jr. writing as he sat in a Birmingham Jail, to a special tribute to the late Toni Morrison, Pulitzer winner and Nobel Prize laureate. Legendary voices of Gwendolyn Brooks, Ruby Dee, Mari Evans and Maya Angelou will also be represented. An original poem by Timothy Van Beverhoudt, drama instructor in the Averitt Youth Theatre is promised.

The featured speaker is Kimberly Foxx who teaches English and Literature at Liberty County High School in Hinesville, Ga. She was recently honored as one of WTOC's Top Teachers. Kimberly earned her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Secondary Education and an Education Specialist degree in Educational Leadership from Columbus State University.
